There are 2 options for airports to fly in to Japan; Haneda or Narita.

The closest train station to the facility is Kandatsu Station (JR Joban Line)

It takes about 1.5 hours by train to ride from central Tokyo, and about 2 hours by train to ride from Haneda/Narita airport.

From either airport, you will need to switch train lines to get on JR Joban Line.

From Kandatsu Station, it is a 15mins Taxi ride to the facility.

We may be able to organize a group bus ride from Kandatsu Station to the facility on 13th morning, if there are many students who take the train and require a taxi.
